Parallels, Paradigms, the Month of October & Turning Point

What do all of these things have in common?

Hello, I'd like to introduce myself. My name is Jack Bechaud, and I'm a Family Service Counselor at McHenry County Memorial Park in Woodstock. Autumn has always been a time of reflection for me and also my most favorite time of year. In business it marks the end of the third quarter and beginning of the fourth – a turning point. At the Woodstock Chamber of Commerce, October is part of the membership drive and a time for renewing old connections and making new ones. It's a time to reflect on the year behind us and plan for the year ahead. At the Park it marks the time of year when all the trees are changing color.



McHenry County Memorial Park was established 71 years ago this October. As I reflect on the history of the Park and what life was like across our communities, country and indeed the world in 1939, I am reminded of similarities not unparallel to what is happening today. Today, like then, we had so many uncertainties. People across our communities were hurting; unemployment was high; we had a democratic President in office; threat of unending war appeared to be on the horizon. People were struggling.

So, what happened? What was the turning point? Perhaps it was a sense of common purpose – something to believe in. Changes in mindset; changes in actions, paradigm shifts. Collectively, these changes lifted the hearts and spirits and our country out of a great depression.

A year ago this month, I started in my current position and also joined the Woodstock Chamber. These were uncharted waters for me. Previously, I was unemployed for more than a year and there appeared to be nothing on the horizon – life felt very uncertain. I decided to change course with a new direction and make some changes. 

MEMBER FEEDBACK NEEDED!

Your Chamber Board has come up with a new—albeit untested—idea that provides revenue for our organization and, at the same time, offers heightened chamber awareness and satisfaction of the gambling instincts of our community members. We are still waiting for final confirmation from the city as to what fees are involved, but they will probably be minimal relative to how much fun and possible profit we will all have.

The concept is that of a “Queen of Hearts” raffle. It goes like this: Tickets are sold for \$1 each. They would be sold at the Chamber office and possibly member businesses if that does not disrupt their regular interaction with customers. Each ticket outlet would have a supply of tickets and a current list of numbers that have been drawn.

The Chamber would supply a locked board with 52 numbered envelopes on it. In each envelope is a different playing card. At a specified time each week, the week’s ticket stubs would be put in a container and mixed up at the Chamber office. One would be drawn. The owner of that ticket would, if present, pick a number corresponding to those envelopes still available on the board in hopes of having the winning card. If the winner is not present, he or she has the option of picking a number ahead of time and having that information conveyed with the ticket stub.

If the number chosen corresponds to the envelope containing the Queen of Hearts, the ticket holder gets 50 percent of what has accumulated in the pot. There are intermediate smaller cash prizes for specified cards, like the ace of spades or the other red queen, to generate interest from the beginning of the raffle until the pot increases as it builds toward ultimate winning of the Queen of Hearts.

After each weekly drawing, the losing tickets are all discarded, and we start again and keep going until someone wins. At that time, the cards are then reshuffled and put back in different envelopes.

This seems like a relatively easy, yet fun, way to generate income for the Chamber and increase our visibility in the community. The Chamber is looking for your feedback on this unique idea. McHenry County Receives Funding to Expand Job Training

Congresswoman Melissa Bean recently secured \$250,000 in job training funds for McHenry County College (MCC) to continue its Flexible and Sustainable Training (F.A.S.T.) program. The F.A.S.T program is the result of a partnership between McHenry County, the McHenry County Economic Development Corporation, the McHenry County Workforce Network, McHenry County Workforce Board, and MCC for workforce training. This is the second installment of funding that has been secured by Congresswoman Melissa Bean with \$387,187 secured for this program in 2008.

The first round of funding provided employer-identified, short-term occupational training needs in the specific fields of Basic Manufacturing, Computer Numerical Controlled (CNC) Machining and Bilingual Nurse Assistance (BNA). MCC launched the Basic Manufacturing course in the spring of 2010 and was able follow the Basic Manufacturing course with CNC Machining and the BNA training this past September.

The Basic Manufacturing course was a 96-hour, 16-week non-credit class that covered shop math, mechanical blueprint reading, measurement, and shop safety. Besides the class, program participants would be able to work toward a National Career Readiness Certificate, demonstrating to employers the competency level in reading and math. They also had the ability to improve their resume writing and interviewing skills through various workshops and worked with the McHenry County Workforce Network to assist them in finding positions in their new field upon completion of the course.

Of those that were enrolled in the Basic Manufacturing course, 42% are now working and another 14% went on to the CNC Machining course. Furthermore, 74% of those enrolled in the Basic Manufacturing course, completed the program.

Last month, another class for the Basic Manufacturing course began, along with courses for Computer Numerical Controlled Machining and Bilingual

Nurse Assistance. Participants in these programs will also work with Workforce Network staff on job search activities.

Marian Central Catholic High School Building Addition

Construction is underway for Marian Central's new Chapel and Science Wing. The two-story 25,000 square-foot addition is scheduled to be completed and ready to use in January 2011. It will include a new chapel, seven state-of-the art combination science classroom/laboratories, and an engineering classroom/laboratory.

Following the opening of the new facilities, the school will renovate one of

"I believe people have supported this effort because they realize this expansion and renovation project will significantly help us as we strive to provide the highest possible quality educational programs for our current and future students. A side benefit is the fact that the project also provided work for some of our local contractors in these challenging economic times."

Marian Central reached a milestone in June of 2009 with the last payment on a \$3.325 million loan from the Diocese of Rockford. That loan covered the last major addition onto the school in the mid 1990's and included ten classrooms, an auditorium, and a gymnasium. The 15-year loan was paid off in 11 years leaving the school currently debt free.
